PETER COLTHUP 5 MILES (8.045KM) ROAD SELF HANDICAP 29 APRIL 2015

The 21st Annual Peter Colthup 5 mile Road Handicap was conducted at Dolamore Reserve, Mentone, on a cool and windless evening conducive to running.

It was very pleasing that Marge Colthup attended with her grandson, Luke, and they presented the medals and trophies after the event.

Other members of the Colthup family and friends attended and several ran in the event and recorded respectable times.

It was also pleasing that runners from Glen Eira, East Burwood, Knox and Southern Peninsula joined the field, including Club Captain, Lavinia Petrie.

The event was conducted as a self handicap whereby competitors nominated their finishing time aware that running too quickly could bring about a disqualification.

The backmarker, Michael Bishop gave a start of 32 minutes to the limit marker, Glen Eira stalwart and previous winner Judy Wines, who was paced by VMA Committee member Andrew Edwards.

The runners in this year's event started on the track, ran out onto the road circuit to complete nine 834 metre laps of the perimeter around Dolamore Reserve and then returned to run one lap on the track.

Jeanne Bryan was first across the line but she and several other competitors were relegated as they ran faster than the 40 second tolerance below their estimate and the rest of the field finished in a 6 minute spread with James O'Brien leading David Dodson by 9 seconds and Kuni Bowden 34 seconds further back in third place.

James was the winner in 2008 and joins Sonya McLennan and Andrew Edwards as the only dual winners of the event in 21 years.

Michael Bishop, recent M40 winner of the VMA 10 Km Championship, was the fastest male in 31.28 and Kuni Bowden was the fastest female finishing in 35.33.

Following the running of the event everyone retired to the clubrooms to join Marge and the family and friends and enjoy a generous supper and presentations. James received the wooden trophy, crafted by Louis Waser, as well as Peter's family's own trophy and the winner's medal while the placegetters and fastest time winners received medals specific to the event.

Special thanks go to those who assisted in managing the event and preparing and serving the supper.

Astrid Rose retires as Subscription Officer

After 20 years as Subscription officer for VMA Astrid has retired from that position with Ewen Wilson taking over the role. She was awarded a gift of appreciation at the recent VMA AGM.

Astrid began an association with VMA as a committee member around 1993. Not long after joining the committee VMA needed a new venue for Committee meetings and Astrid offered her home. For a few years Committee meetings were well attended (and long) probably due in no small measure to Astrid's suppers.

By 1995 Astrid began as subscription officer receiving files of members and some assistance from Colin Browne in managing data in Excel format and using Windows 95 (all new to her). In 1995 Astrid also became Treasurer for the Throwers Venue a role she still has today.

Initially all memberships were received by post or through collection by Venue Managers which were then passed on. With membership peaking at around 1200 in past years this was a major task. In early years all payments were by cheques, cash or money order. VMA moved to accept credit card payments by 2006, and finally in 2013 on-line payments.

Astrid, however, was not only involved with subscriptions but also took on the role of uniforms in 1997 after Eric Greaves became gravely ill. In about 2000 she also took over track suits after Doug Orr passed away and then also the range of different pieces of clothing that Peter Colthup used to market



for VMA. Astrid welcomed Graham Philpott taking over uniforms etc around the time he was designing a new VMA uniform with Jennifer Baldwin.

Astrid always worked very assiduously in ensuring members were paid up and getting this information on a regular basis to Venue Managers, the Treasurer and other relevant persons. Late renewing members involved a lot of work in chasing them up with letters through the post (often more than 200) or by phone. With more members having E-mail addresses this task became a lot easier and cheaper for VMA but nevertheless usually two reminders either by one method or another was needed.

As subscription officer, Astrid also became involved in most Championships. She collected payments when Championships were local, checked the financial status of athletes who had entered interstate or overseas championships and if they were not current or never had been VMA members she then chased them up so they could become financial and eligible to compete.

Astrid was awarded a VMA service award jointly with Graeme (largely due to the efforts to smooth out problems for the Throwers venue) and she was also awarded Life Membership of VMA.

During her years of service Astrid was also a trained Throws official, officiated or volunteered at the Deaf Olympics, World Masters Games and Commonwealth Games all held in Melbourne.

Congratulations Astrid for a wonderful achievement.

A record number of 41 competitors turned up for this year's VMA 3k Championship which was run, as usual, before the AGM. We held 2 divisions with the slower runners starting first.

Heather Marasco, a newcomer from Doncaster, had a battle out in front all the way with George Rennie M70 (Collingwood), but George's experience saw him first over the line in 12.32.7. George's excellent run saw him achieve the highest age graded percentage for the Men with 83.1%.

The second race was a tussle between Grant Simpson M45 (Geelong) and the M40 Shane Draper (Aberfeldie) and another newcomer Michael Bishop (Mentone). In the last lap Shane outsprinted both Grant and Michael to take out the race in 9.53.4.

Susi Wilson W45 (Knox) was the fastest Female in 11.24.3 followed closely by Stacey Van Dueren W55 (Coburg) in 11.36.4. Stacey's AG% of 92.7 was the best of the day.

In the first race Pam Mews W80 (Mentone) established a New Victorian record with time of 30.06.5

BROWNE SHIELD RESULTS AFTER 2 EVENTS

The Browne Shield looks poised for a closer result this year with Aberfeldie, Collingwood, Glen Eira and Coburg all producing strong results in the first two events. At the 10k Track Race, Knox only had 2 competitors and started off in fifth place. Those competitors however, were the two highest scoring athletes - Lavinia Petrie and Mike Bieleny.

Aberfeldie, who has led after both rounds, has had one terrific performance from Bronwen Cardy and two from Greg Moore. But were helped out with Shane Draper joining in for the Cross Country, I feel they will need Bronwen back to hold off Knox.

Coburg has had two very strong runs from Stacey Van Dueren but suffered from having only two competitors in the second event.

How the Browne Shield Scoring works. Each competitor's finish time is age graded. In the Individual Competition the competitors best 4 scores over the 5 events count. In the Venue Competition, the best 3 scores for each event are tallied and all events are counted. It is a big disadvantage for a Venue not to have 3 competitors at each event.

Although her athletic career has now ceased, Gwen, at 92 years of age, after almost three decades of truly remarkable achievements richly deserves this recognition for her outstanding career in Masters Athletics.

Born in Adelaide in 1922, Gwen excelled throughout her school years winning many awards in hockey and athletics. However with the advent of World War 2, she ultimately enlisted with the Red Cross and later met and married her husband Jim in 1945 and subsequently raised 4 children, leaving little time for any form of serious exercise.

It then wasn't until the prospect of competing in the 1987 VII World Veterans Athletics Championships, in Melbourne that Gwen decided to join Veteran Athletics and begin a belated return to the sport she loved, at the age of 65.

Inevitably this was just the incentive she needed to reignite her remarkable versatility, even at the highest level, and with relatively little preparation she excelled 2 Gold and 3 Bronze medals against the world's best. Her results were 100m in



16.09; 200m in 33.71; Long Jump 3.16; Triple Jump 7.22 and High Jump 1.22, the latter two being W65-69 World Records.

Now on a high following here initial success, she travelled to Brisbane for her inaugural National Championships in 1988 and accumulated 6 Gold and 2 Silver medals in 8 individual events.

With her appetite for world class competition now firmly entrenched, at the 1989 VIII World Veterans Championships in Eugene, Oregon Gwen once again shone, winning 6 medals - 3 Gold; 1 Silver and 2 Bronze. In the 4x 100m relay, together with top W65 Aussie sprinters Joyce Green, Aileen Hogan and Ann Cooper, she set a new World Record. Although Gwen continued her relentless attack on world records at State and National Titles throughout the Nineties, it wasn't until the 2001 14th World Veterans Athletics Championships in Brisbane that she made her last appearance at the top level with 4 more medals, giving her a total of 15 at the highest level in Masters Athletics. On turning eighty in 2003, she then set a remarkable 11 World and National records in 5

individual events 100m; Discus; Hammer; Weight Throw and Throws Pentathlon, and currently still owns 12 Australian Records achieved over 3 age groups.

She has accumulated a remarkable 172 medals at major Championships and been rewarded with the 2003 Royce Foley Award and in 2000 by the AMA for multi events (W75).

As a long time member of the East Burwood Venue, it was a testament to Gwen's achievements when, in 2004, the Venue instigated a 100 metre handicap in her name. Needless to say, it is enthusiastically contested each year.

Finally, we can say that this amazing lady who for so many years was not only a role model but to say the least, a true inspiration to all involved in athletics.





Knox Masters - 13th May, 2015. Winning Team Presentation Night.

On the 8th of October 2014 the Knox Masters Venue had their first night of competing in an event that would earn points for their team. With lots of thinking and preparation on how we could run a bit of a competition with the venue using everyone in a range of different events. We come up with this. We planned the fixture in late August to start in October and run for the next three months. Each week we had an event that we called the "Blue Teams Event". The Blue Teams Events ranged each week from a walk, sprint, middle distance and long distance, these blue events were all NOT's (nominate own time) or self-handicap events.

Athletes were all allocated into a team, we had three teams, the red, green and the purple team. We didn't have to worry about age or ability because anyone could win these events, as to the reason of the NOT and self Hcp races.

Points were awarded to each athlete just for turning up, (even if you didn't compete in any events) for every event you competed in on the night and also for doing duty. The blue team events scored points for competing in it and extra points if you finished in the first 10 placings of the self hcp's or the closest on time in the NOT's.

Nobody was allowed to wear a watch unless it had a dot covering up the face of the watch, and there was also a catch in the self hcp races. You could not run, faster than between 2 - 20secs depending on the distance of the race, faster than your self-handicap time. So each athlete would nominate their own handicap start then try to finish in the top ten placings to earn extra points and not get disqualified.

Disqualification margins were - 800m walk or a 3km or greater run - 20 secs

1500m, 2km and a mile -	12 secs
800m, 1km, 1.2km and a half mile -	6 secs
500m and 600m -	4 secs
300m and 400m -	2 secs

It was a hit, athletes started turning up in their team colours and the allocated Team Leader for each team did their best to get their team members to participate in as many events as possible to score as many points as they could for their team. The enthusiasm was up and everyone was really enjoying the competition.

A couple of things that stood out for me was the first 800m walk that was the blue team event, it attracted athletes that NEVER did the walk. There were so many in the walk event that it took extra time to do all the recording. Another event was the 300m sprint, on a normal night we would be lucky to have 6 runners compete in this distance. Well after the rallying of everyone by the team leaders we had 26 competitors running in the 300m, it was a pb for that event.

At the end of the night we would announce the winners and then have a spot prize draw and the winner of that would also get points for their team. Then the team leaders would read out the progressive scores each week and also who in their team was getting the most points.

It was a lot of fun and a lot of work but it was worth it, so worth it that we kept it running until the end of April 2015. Then after 7 months of team participation we announced the winning team.

There were 18 athletes on each team our team leaders were Melissa MacEoin for the Green Team, Gary Stewart for the Red Team and Anne McPherson for the Purple Team. After 7 months the points were a lot closer than I thought they would be. The winning team was The Red Team with a total score of – 2481 points, closely in second place The Green Team with a score of – 2459 and followed by The Purple Team with a score of 2393 points. Everyone on the winning team was awarded a prize and the highest point scorers in each team was also awarded a prize. (See presentation photos)

We will be doing this again at Knox, starting up our team competition by about October this year.
